DELIVERING SAFELYA

Guidance for the delivery and receipt of building products



IF YOU ARE DELIVERING BUILDING PRODUCTS:

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE ON SITE...

△ Comply with restrictions regarding delivery times and approach route(s)

AFTER YOU ARRIVE ON SITE...

- A Report to the site manager or designated site office and sign the site register
- ▲ Follow site rules and procedures at all times before, during and after the delivery

WEAR YOUR PPE

- ▲ You should wear your PPE at all times when out of your vehicle, including when descending from your cab
- ⚠ The minimum requirement is safety footwear (some sites may not accept rigger boots), high visibility vest/ jacket and hard hat secured by chin-strap
- ▲ Some sites may require additional PPE
- You must not wear shorts on site

FOLLOW THE SITE RULES...

Site rules may include:

- A Parking instructions (before, during and after loading/off-loading)
- ▲ Use of mobile phones/CB radios
- ▲ Traffic signs and site speed limits
- ▲ Traffic and pedestrian routes
- Reversing arrangements

RISK ASSESS THE AREA

♠ For example, ensure there are no overhead obstructions such as power or telephone cables in the off-loading area























ACCESSING/EGRESSING THE VEHICLE OR LIFTING EQUIPMENT

- ▲ Use an approved route only
- Maintain 3 points of contact at all times
- ▲ Keep access clear of slip and trip hazards







WORKING AT HEIGHT

- ▲ Avoid the need to work at height
- ▲ Walk in the corridors between products
- ▲ Keep trailer bed clear of slip and trip hazards
- △ Do not climb on top of products

WORKING SAFELY

- △ Stabiliser legs/outriggers must be fully deployed on both sides
- ▲ Mobile phones and handheld communication devices must not be used whilst operating machinery
- A Report all vehicle accidents, injuries, near misses and other safety concerns
- ▲ Always work in accordance with the safe systems of work in which you have been trained
- ▲ Take extra care when stacking packs/pallets. If there are any indications of instability, take corrective action
- ⚠ You are authorised to stop loading/off-loading your vehicle if you feel it is unsafe

DOCUMENTATION

- ▲ You should carry:
 - Evidence of your training and competence
 - Inspection certificate(s) for lifting equipment
- ▲ If requested, arrange to provide copies of safe systems of work and risk assessments

IF YOU ARE TAKING DELIVERY OF BUILDING PRODUCTS...

BEFORE DELIVERY...









DURING/AFTER DELIVERY...

▲ Make the supplier aware of any issues, injuries or near misses relating to the delivery

ON ARRIVAL...





- △ Identify a safe parking area for the delivery vehicle
- ▲ Ensure there is a nominated person responsible for monitoring the delivery
- ▲ Make site specific rules available to the driver
- Provide a responsible person to assist with reversing if required
- ▲ Where required, request evidence of the training/competence of the driver to undertake the lifting operation safely

DURING DELIVERY...

- ⚠ Provide a safe recognised route around the site, which minimises reversing
- Provide designated safe off-loading areas that are:
- Clearly identified, obstruction free and adequately lit
- Of firm and level ground suitable for lifting operations, outrigger deployment and safe/stable stocking of product
- Controlled for access and movement
- Provided with a safe refuge area for the driver, which may be the vehicle cab, allowing the driver full visibility
- ⚠ Where required, lay out pallets that are of appropriate size and strength on firm and level ground

A Recognise that the driver is not authorised

- to offload to any areas outside the safe specification of the loading equipment ⚠ Provide a receptacle for disposal of any waste
- ▲ Be aware that drivers may on occasion need to access the trailer bed and in doing so will follow their safe systems of work
